I love to look at people's hands. Hands can show us so much about a person. Does this person like to work in the dirt? Maybe

they are a mechanic or a farmer's hands. Perhaps they are free of calluses because the person works in an office. Maybe they are young and just learning all the things that can be done with our hands. Perhaps there are signs of playing instruments or creativity. Maybe the hands show years of abuse, or signs of arthritis. Perhaps like my grandmother's or my dad's hands at the end of their lives, they are covered in bruises from unknown sources. Smooth, polished, gnarled, aged, young, they are hands that can do the work of Christ in our world.

Hands work. Hands play. Hands pray. Hands hurt. Hands heal. Hands help. All hands can be instruments of Christ.

Sometimes we think our hands are imperfect. Perhaps missing a portion of a digit or an entire digit. Maybe you were born that way, or maybe it is due to injury. You may think your hand is imperfect... but to God... your hands are far from imperfect. Your hands are still Christ's hands in

this world, which makes your hands beautiful.

While taking photos of hands for the artwork now displayed at St Luke, I often heard similar phrases to this: "Oh, I don't have nice hands." I disagreed with each person who claimed this. And as I put together the photo display, I found myself thinking... "How beautiful!" There is an old praise song titled "How Beautiful". It speaks of how beautiful the hands of Christ are. In the past



I have thought about this as meaning only Jesus's hands. Now I am beginning to think this can mean our hands as well, since we are the hands of Christ in the world today.






